The Yankalilla Library marks final SAPLN member to go live on SirsiDynix Symphony

LEHI, Utah (Oct. 1, 2014)— SirsiDynix is pleased to announce that the final member of the South Australian Public Library Network (SAPLN) is prepared to go live with SirsiDynix Symphony. Yankalilla will mark the 77th SAPLN site to go live since the consortium's Symphony implementation began in 2012. With a complete Symphony integration— and with some sites running on two databases or through multiple branches—SAPLN will include circulation materials from 80 databases, 159 sites, and over four million items.
